SUBJECT: **Allocation of Stimulus Money**

---

Today, the US Department of Energy (DOE) announced that it will make available \$3.2 billion in Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant Program (EECBG) money, as provided by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA). EECBGs are provided to local governments, states, territories, and Indian tribes, to fund projects that reduce energy use and fossil fuel emissions, and that improve in energy efficiency.

Large Texas cities and counties are eligible to receive approximately \$163 million in direct Federal grants. The State Energy Conservation Office (SECO), administered by the Texas Comptroller, will receive \$45 million; 60 percent of those funds must be allocated directly to smaller, non-entitlement municipalities and counties, i.e., cities under 35,000 and counties under 200,000. Our understanding is that the remaining 40 percent will be allocated through discretionary grants. Three Indian tribes within Texas will be eligible to receive a total of \$171,500. Please see the attached list of funds that will be available to Texas' cities and counties.

Despite the fact the DOE has determined the amount that Texas' larger cities and counties will be eligible to receive, they must still apply for the funds. The application due date for states is May 26, 2009 at 8:00:00 PM Eastern Time. The application due date for cities, counties, and Indian tribes eligible for direct formula grants is June 25, 2009 at 8:00:00 PM Eastern Time.
