## **RECOVERY ACT FUNDS**

This substantial amendment to the State of Texas Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program 2008 Action Plan covers the use of \$19,473,698 of supplemental CDBG funds the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) will provide under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, Public Law 111-5 (the "Recovery Act").
